Records

To set a record, a Stacker must participate in a WSSA Sanctioned Tournament/Event.

The following protocol must be followed:

1. Must use a StackMat® Competition Timer.
2. Must be video taped for review and verification purposes.
3. Must use 3 Judges* (one designated Head Judge) to judge each try. After each try the 3 Judges confer. The Head Judge will then designate with a color-coded card the outcome of that try. (Green-Clean Run, Yellow-Try in Question (Immediate Video Review) and Red – Scratch).

*A Finals Judge may not be a family member or the Sport Stacking Instructor of the Stacker.
